

TOOL Physician Leaders on Unit-Based Teams

PURPOSE

This tool provides information to physicians who are joining a new UBT or joining an existing team. Physicians on UBTs will find information about their role, why they are part of the team, and their responsibilities to the team.

When to Use

Use this tool when starting a new UBT or when adding new physicians to the team.

How to Use

Review this document to ensure new physicians joining a UBT understand the following information:

- Why physician leaders should actively sponsor UBTs
- What will be different for physicians as UBT leaders and team members
- What will remain the same for physicians as UBT leaders and members.





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Why should physician leaders actively sponsor UBTs?

Here are some reasons why it is important for UBTs to function well:

- A better place to work leads to less turnover, and stable staffing leads to happier physicians and better continuity of care.
- Total panel ownership and management requires a good team.
- The team is the building block in the delivery system.

What will be different for physicians as UBT leaders and team members?

Here's how physicians will change:

- Physicians will show more leadership.
- They will be expected to seek and use input from the whole team to improve care delivery.
- Physicians will enjoy more support from the team.
- They will think about micro-system improvements much more.
- The team will improve the work flows more.
- Physicians will communicate more clearly and listen attentively, as will the whole team.
- They will share some of the nonclinical decision making.
- They will use some standard improvement methodologies so their successful practices will be more easily communicated to others.
- They will be in a better position to phase in new initiatives.
- It will be easier to try their ideas since they will have a track record of successes with their team.

What will remain the same for physicians as UBT leaders and members?

This will not change for physicians:

- They ultimately will be responsible for clinical decision making.
- All members of the team care for the patients and members and keep them as healthy as possible.
- Physicians are still the leaders of the clinical team.
- If the team is already high performing, it is likely very little will change.
