Plan for Safety



Every Kaiser Permanente employee, manager, physician and member has a right to expect a safe place to work and receive care. It's also why every department must have a safety action plan to identify hazards, develop solutions and ensure a safe working environment.

Step 1: Does your department have a safety action plan?

 Ask your unit-based team co-leads if your department has a <u>safety action plan</u>, a web-based tool that enables your team to identify, track, and monitor common hazards. To access the <u>safety action plan</u>, log onto the KP network.

¶⊲[≫] Step 2: Take Action

» If your department has a <u>safety action plan</u>, ask your UBT co-leads to download and share it with the team. » If there is no plan, create a UBT project using SMART goals (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, Time-bound) to address department challenges.

Step 3: Follow up

- » Ask your UBT co-leads to regularly share the department safety plan for follow-up and action.
- » Keep safety issues high in people's thoughts and actions.
- » Remind your co-workers to look out for one another and follow department safety guidelines.
